Settlement Examination William Pengelly 1772

Devon (to wit) The examination of William Pengelly now residing in the parish of Bratton Clevelly in the said County of Devon Labourer, taken upon oath before us two of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said County the first day of May 1772

Who upon his Oath saith, that he was born in the said parish of Bratton Clevelly, served no Apprenticeship, that about twenty four years ago he hired himself for a year to Robert Day of Bratton Clevelly aforesaid yeoman at the Rate of four pounds and Ten shillings, that he served him three years and received his wages, that about four years ago he went into the parish of Stowford in the said County and rented of Mr William Spry an Estate of five pounds and Eleven shillings year – and another Estate in the said parish the property of Mr Richard Turner of Tavistock in the said County of four pounds and Ten shillings a year and paid the Tythe these of, that he hath never since gained any Subsequent Settlement.
