## **Consent to Apprenticeship of Samuel Coombe 1823**

County of Devon – To Thomas Baskerville and Richard James Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Bratton Clovelly in the said County of Devon.

Whereas you the said Overseers having proposed unto us William Arundel Harris Arundel and John Hearle Tremayne Esquires two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace acting in and for the Hundred of Lifton within the said County of Devon under and by Virtue of an Act of Parliament passed in the fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, intituled, "An Act to Regulate the Binding of Parish Apprentices," to bind Samuel Coombe a poor Child, aged 15 Years, belonging to your said Parish of Bratton Clovelly Apprentice to Thomas Pengelly of the said parish of Bratton Clovelly Yeoman

And whereas we the said Justices having this Day enquired into the propriety of binding the said Child Apprentice, and having particularly examined and considered the several Directions contained in the said recited Act, and also the circumstances and Character of the said Thomas Pengelly do hereby declare that the said Thomas Pengelly is a fit person to take the said Samuel Coombe Apprentice as aforesaid; and do Order that you the said Overseers shall be at Liberty to bind such Child Apprentice accordingly.
